C'est un vin qui a considérablement évolué au fil du temps. Conçu à l'origine comme une entrée de gamme, le vin est maintenant uniquement fait avec des vieilles vignes de grenache et de carignan orientées nord. Couleur pourpre profonde. Nez de fruits noirs, de mures et de cèdre. C'est dense et riche en bouche mais jamais lourd sur les fruits noirs, la mine de crayon, le minéral et les épices. Beau volume de bouche et belle densité en finale.

Alcool : 14,50 %

Composition: 60% Carignan, 30% Grenache, 10% Cabernet Sauvignon

James Suckling (JS) : 93 Points (2020)



Dark cherries, plums and racy berries, followed by tangy Mediterranean herbs, minerals and roasted spices. A medium-bodied Priorat with a good crunch of strawberries and roasted herbs. Flavorful, yet juicy and precise, with silky tannins and a linear, expressive berry finish. Lots of energy here. You want to drink this now, even though it will hold well for the next 5-8 years. Drink or hold.

Robert Parker (RP) : 94 Points (2019)



The regional 2019 Les Terrasses Velles Vinyes was produced with a blend of grapes from 80 plots in eight villages from Priorat, 82% Garnacha with 17% Cariñena and 1% white grapes, a year unusually high in Garnacha and unusually low in Cariñena that suffered a lot from the heat. The destemmed and lightly crushed grapes fermented in concrete and oak vats with indigenous yeasts, and the wine matured in French oak barrels for 12 months. What happened here is that Cariñena was burned by a heat spike of 43 degrees Celsius on the 28th of June, and there was a wildfire in Montsant that perhaps could have warmed things up even more. I think there might be a change toward more Garnacha and elegance in the wines from Alvaro Palacios in Priorat, as this is brighter and less rustic than this wine used to be, more polished, perfumed and fine. The year of heat and drought.

Wine Spectator (WS) : 93 Points (2019)



A juicy red, offering raspberry ganache and red licorice flavors, a fragrant skein of dried sage and milled white pepper and rich hints of smoke and toast. This concentrated, medium- to full-bodied version remains fresh and focused, thanks to the tang of orange peel acidity and fine, taut tannins. Garnacha and Samsó.



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
