Region and Vineyards

Magari is produced in the **Bolgheri D.O.P.**, Tuscany's renowned coastal wine region. The vineyards are planted on two distinct soil types: **dark soils rich in lime and clay**, which provide power and depth, and **white soils composed of limestone, clay, and stones**, contributing to the wine's finesse and minerality.

The **2021 vintage** was shaped by a harsh, rainy winter that replenished water reserves, followed by a cold, dry spring marked by two frosts, which delayed vine growth but caused minimal damage. The summer was unusually cool, with fresh northwest winds in July and August allowing the grapes to ripen slowly and evenly. This resulted in a later harvest than usual, yielding fruit with exceptional balance and concentration.

Winemaking

Magari 2021 is a blend of **Cabernet Franc, Cabernet Sauvignon, and Petit Verdot**, with each variety fermented and macerated separately for approximately **15 days**. The wine was aged for **12 months in oak barrels**, followed by additional aging in the bottle prior to release. This careful vinification preserves the individuality of each varietal while achieving a harmonious blend.

The result is a wine that reflects both the unique character of the Bolgheri terroir and the elegance of the vintage.

Tasting Notes

- **Color:** Deep purplish red.
- **Aroma:** An enticing bouquet of black fruits such as plums and blackcurrants, complemented by notes of black tea and Mediterranean herbs like rosemary and thyme.
- **Palate:** Dense yet elegant tannins create a structured mouthfeel, while a subtle salinity adds complexity and depth. The wine is fresh, vibrant, and unmistakably Bolgheri in style.



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Did you know?

The name **Magari** is an Italian expression meaning "If only it were true...!" or "Maybe...". It embodies a sense of optimism and irony, reflecting the determination and vision behind the Ca' Marcanda project while adding a touch of playful charm.

Wine Pairing Ideas

- **Tagliata di Manzo (sliced Tuscan steak):** The wine's structure and salinity complement the steak's savory flavors.
- **Wild boar stew:** The bold fruit and herbal notes enhance the richness of the dish.
- **Grilled eggplant with balsamic glaze:** The wine's salinity and herbal undertones balance the smoky and sweet flavors of the eggplant.
- **Aged Pecorino Toscano:** The firm tannins and fruity profile complement the cheese's nutty and salty character.



Robert Parker (RP) : 96 Points (2021)

The Ca' Marcanda 2021 Bolgheri Rosso Magari is a blend of Cabernet Franc, Cabernet Sauvignon and Petit Verdot. It brings forth a floral bouquet, showing subtle elegance at the start. Give it a few moments and the wine hits on all cylinders with integrated oak, bright fruit, black cherry, pomegranate seed, iris root and dustings of oak spice that never overshadow the fruit. The wine is refreshingly uncomplicated but shows refined nuance instead. This is the proverbial understated elegance that Gaja achieves so beautifully. It closes with lovely acidity and dusty tannins.



James Suckling (JS) : 93 Points (2019)

This is a firm yet velvety-textured red with blackberry, sage, pine-needle and dried-flower aromas and flavors. It's medium-to full-bodied with a lovely mouth feel and a long finish. Drink after 2023, when everything will have come more together.



Decanter (DCT) : 92 Points (2019)

In contrast to the 2004, the 2019 Magari has no Merlot; instead it's composed of 60% Cabernet Franc, 30% Cabernet Sauvignon and 10% Petit Verdot. It's a floral expression, with lavender and violet scents and bright red and black berries. There's a touch of cream on the palate alongside ripe black fruits, black tea and wild strawberry, leading to a slightly spicy finish. Softly textured but well structured, it displays great balance and should improve in the cellar for years to come. (JB)
