Limari Valley, Chile

Region and Vineyards

The Limarí Valley, part of Chile's Coquimbo Region, lies just 21 kilometers (13 miles) from the Pacific Ocean. This proximity ensures a cool maritime climate, with consistent breezes that moderate temperatures, preserving the grapes' natural acidity and vibrant flavors.

The vineyard, planted 20 years ago, is managed with **VSP trellising** and **Guyot pruning systems** to optimize canopy management. Its soils, composed of **clay with a high percentage of calcium carbonate**, provide excellent drainage and impart a distinctive minerality to the wine. This terroir is ideal for producing balanced, elegant Pinot Noir with complex aromatics and a fresh, structured palate.

Winemaking

The grapes for this wine were harvested in the **third week of February 2020**, ensuring optimal ripeness. The vinification process is focused on maintaining the purity and complexity of the fruit. Fermentation took place in **small 1,000-liter vats**, incorporating **30% whole clusters** for added structure and aromatic depth.

The fermentation was **spontaneous**, with no added yeasts or enzymes, at an average temperature of **24°C (75°F)**. After fermentation, the wine was aged for **12 months in old Burgundian barrels**, allowing for subtle integration of flavors while preserving the varietal character.

Tasting Notes

- **Color**: Medium ruby red with brilliant clarity.
- Aroma: Complex and inviting, featuring notes of red berries, cherries, violets, and a hint of forest floor.
- **Palate**: Medium-bodied with vibrant **fruit intensity** and a crisp acidity. Fine, chalky tannins provide structure, leading to a long, lingering finish with a touch of minerality.





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Did You Know?

De Martino is a pioneer in Chilean winemaking, recognized for its innovative approach and respect for tradition. The winery was the first in Chile to label a wine as **Carmenere** in 1996 and is renowned for its work in uncovering and revitalizing **historic vineyards** across the country.

Wine Pairing Ideas

- **Duck confit with red berry sauce**: The wine's red fruit notes complement the richness of the duck and the tartness of the sauce.
- Wild mushroom risotto: Its earthy complexity enhances the umami flavors of the dish.
- **Grilled salmon with herbs**: The wine's acidity balances the richness of the fish and the herbal flavors.
- **Roasted root vegetables with thyme**: The wine's freshness and minerality pair beautifully with the caramelized sweetness of the vegetables.

Robert Parker (RP): 92 Points (2018)

They managed to get some fruit from the Talinay vineyard to use in the 2018 Legado Pinot Noir, and the 2019 is 100% from that limestone-rich vineyard in Limarí. I had not tasted this wine since the 2015 vintage, and the wine feels quite different, with more freshness and a chalky sensation on the palate, moderate alcohol and balanced acidity. It matured in used barriques for 11 months, and the oak is virtually imperceptible. 16,416 bottles produced.





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
