

Known for its structure and precision, Redoma Tinto is crafted from traditional Douro grape varieties, including Tinta Amarela, Tinta Roriz, and Touriga Franca, showcasing the complex character of the region's terroir.

Region and Vineyards

Niepoort Redoma Tinto 2019 hails from the **Douro Valley**, one of the world's oldest and most dramatic wine regions. The vineyards used for Redoma are located on north-facing slopes of Quinta de Nápoles and in the Pinhão Valley, where schist soils and steep terraces provide an ideal environment for the cultivation of indigenous Douro grape varieties. The cooler, north-facing aspect helps to preserve freshness and acidity in the grapes, while the **old vines**, aged over **70 years**, contribute to the wine's concentration and depth.

These vineyards are situated at altitudes ranging from 150 to 500 meters, allowing for a slow ripening process, which enhances the complexity and balance of the fruit. The extreme conditions of the Douro, with hot days and cool nights, play a crucial role in creating wines that are both powerful and elegant.



The 2019 growing season was characterized by **dry weather**, with warm temperatures in spring, followed by a cooler summer. These conditions allowed for a slow, even ripening of the grapes, resulting in fruit with excellent balance between sugar, acidity, and tannins. The harvest began in **August** and ended in **October**.

Fermentation took place in stainless steel lagares using 100% whole bunches, with mechanized stomping. The wine then underwent malolactic fermentation and aged for 22 months in old wooden barrels, allowing it to develop its complex, layered profile. This traditional approach to winemaking helps preserve the purity and authenticity of the vineyard expression, giving Redoma its distinctive character.

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Tasting Notes

- Color: Deep ruby red with violet hues.
- Aroma: The nose is delicate yet complex, with aromas of red fruit, such as cherries, intertwined with floral notes, minty freshness, and a touch of smokiness, adding layers of complexity.
- Palate: The wine is well-structured with good volume and a silky texture. It
 reveals flavors of spice, red berries, and a balanced acidity that leads to a long,
 lingering finish. The tannins are fine and integrated, giving the wine a precise,
 harmonious profile.

Did you know?

Niepoort Redoma Tinto is considered a benchmark for Douro wines, being one of the first table wines to challenge the traditional focus on Port production in the region. **Redoma** reflects **Dirk Niepoort's** vision of creating elegant, terroir-driven wines that showcase the complexity and aging potential of Douro reds.

Wine Pairing Ideas

- **Pepper Steak**: The wine's spicy and smoky notes complement the peppery flavors of the steak, while its structure balances the richness of the meat.
- **Venison**: The bold flavors of the wine are a perfect match for game, with its depth enhancing the earthiness of venison.
- **Mushroom Dishes**: For a vegetarian option, the earthy and floral characteristics of the wine pair beautifully with **spicy mushroom** dishes.
- **Grilled Red Meats**: The firm tannins and complex fruit profile make Redoma a great match for grilled meats, especially when seasoned with herbs and spices.

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Robert Parker (RP): 94 Points (2018)

The 2018 Redoma is a field blend of typical grapes (like Tinta Amarela, Touriga Franca, Touriga Nacional, Tinta Roriz and Tinto Cão) aged for 22 months in used 1,000-liter Portuguese vats. It comes in at just 12.5% alcohol. My pick for the best of the upper-level 2018 reds this issue, and a relative bargain besides, this easily coats the palate. Then, it shows off its power. Like its upper-level 2018 siblings, the fruit profile is not terribly expressive just now, and this is going to need a couple of years of cellaring to show its best. The upside potential seems most likely to be realized here in the group, however. Time will ultimately give us that answer, so come back around 2026. This is another of Niepoort's 2018s that you will want to buy only if you can cellar it, at least for a few years. It looks like a beauty in the making, but let's be a little cautious considering how closed and tight it is. There were 31,000 bottles produced from old vines (70+years).







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James Suckling (JS): 94 Points (2017)

Lots of dark berries, black cherries and blackberries with just a note of olives. Full-bodied with plenty of fruit, yet there's freshness and vibrancy with a nice, linear flow running through it. Drink or hold.



Wine Spectator (WS): 92 Points (2017)

A harmonious, minerally red, with fresh currant and pomegranate notes infused with tea, anise, savory herb, woodsy spice and floral accents. More restrained in profile, but distinctive. Moderate, integrated tannins. Tinta Amarela, Touriga Franca, Rufete, Tinta Roriz and Tinto Cão. Drink now through 2025.
