

Region and Vineyards



This harvest was marked by cool and humid conditions, allowing the grape clusters to mature slowly, developing a perfect balance of sugar, acidity, and tannins. Zuccardi's careful approach to plot and soil type selection for each harvest, honed over a decade, ensures that every section of the vineyard contributes to the wine's layered complexity.



Zuccardi Polígonos Gualtallary Malbec was vinified with a minimalist approach, focused on capturing the essence of the terroir. The wine underwent **fermentation with native yeasts** in concrete vessels, preserving the natural flavors of the grape and soil. The wine was then **aged in concrete tanks**, a choice that maintains the freshness and minerality of the wine without any oak influence, highlighting the purity of the Gualtallary terroir.

This **100% Malbec** has an alcohol content of **14%**, a total acidity of **5.62 g/L**, and a pH of **3.6**, resulting in a balanced, mineral-rich wine with freshness and structure.

Tasting Notes

- **Color**: Deep purple with a vivid intensity that reflects its high-altitude origins.
- **Aroma**: Aromas of **blackberry**, **violet**, and mineral nuances, with subtle earthy and herbal hints that mirror the high-calcium soils.
- **Palate**: Medium to full-bodied with firm, refined tannins and a crisp acidity. The palate offers layers of dark fruit, a touch of salinity, and a lingering mineral finish that speaks to the wine's unique terroir.

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Did you know?

The **Polígonos series** was created to highlight the individuality of each village within the Uco Valley. Named after "polygons" or mapped shapes that delineate each unique vineyard site, the wines allow a deep exploration of the landscape's diversity. In Gualtallary, the unique calcareous soils and high elevation make for a Malbec with precision and minerality that is rare in Argentine wine.

Wine Pairing Ideas

- **Grilled Lamb with Mint Chimichurri**: The wine's tannins and mineral depth enhance the flavors of lamb, while its acidity cuts through the richness of the chimichurri.
- **Herbed Goat Cheese Tart**: The wine's crisp acidity and minerality balance the creamy goat cheese and complement the tart's herbal notes.
- **Wild Mushroom and Thyme Risotto**: Earthy mushroom flavors harmonize with the wine's mineral notes, and its acidity balances the risotto's richness.
- **Pork Tenderloin with Fennel and Apple**: The wine's dark fruit and acidity match the sweetness of apple and the herbal notes of fennel, creating a complex pairing.



Robert Parker (RP): 94 Points (2021)

The 2021 Poligonos Gualtallary Malbec is the most structured of the Malbecs from Poligonos, a high place with early ripening, where deciding the harvesting date is key. There are always lots of aromas of herbs and flowers here, the wildest of the Malbecs; it's ripe and intense (14% alcohol) but balanced and fresh, a very good representation of the place. Here, they ferment with 30% to 50% full clusters, no more, as the tannic structure is big and more stems might harden the wine. It is powerful and elegant, wild but refined, which might sound like a contradiction, but it's something wonderful. 20,000 bottles were filled in August 2022.



Wines & Spirits (W&S): 94 Points (2019)

Sebastián Zuccardi uses no oak and no cultured yeasts to make this wine, a stunningly fresh, zesty malbec. Sourced from a vineyard at 3,600 feet in altitude, where there's plenty of calcareous stone in the alluvial scree, it feels almost Burgundian in its combination of complexity and transparency. Give it a decant before you serve it, as it takes time for the wine to shake off its initial tension; then it blossoms, with notes of fir tree, stone and fresh-picked berries.
