
Noemia by Bodega Noemia de Patagonia is an exquisite Malbec from one of the world's most southern vineyards in Rio Negro Valley, Patagonia, showcasing intense dark fruit and remarkable depth.

Region and Vineyards



Certified organic by Ecocert and partially biodynamic, the vineyard uses double **Guyot training** to support the vine growth and optimize fruit quality. The vineyard's location, combined with organic cultivation, results in low yields and highly concentrated grapes that embody the character and elegance of this unique Patagonian terroir.



The **Noemia** is crafted entirely from **Malbec** grapes, meticulously hand-harvested in March to capture their optimal ripeness. After picking, the grapes are transported in refrigerated trucks to preserve their nuanced character, then fermented in small **stainless steel fermenters** to ensure precise temperature control. The wine undergoes malolactic fermentation for added softness and complexity.

For aging, Noemia spends 15 to 24 months in French demi-muids from the famed cooperage Tonnellerie Darnajou, imparting a subtle oak influence that complements the wine's fruit profile. Following barrel aging, it undergoes an additional six months of bottle aging to refine its structure before release, resulting in a wine with substantial complexity and a smooth, balanced finish.

Tasting Notes

- Color: Deep violet with garnet edges.
- **Aroma**: Intense aromas of dark fruit, such as blackberry and plum, intertwined with hints of coffee, dark chocolate, and spice.
- **Palate**: Elegant and well-balanced, offering layered dark fruit flavors with well-integrated tannins and acidity. A long, persistent finish underscores the wine's depth and minerality, making it a memorable Malbec.

Did you know?

Bodega Noemia's **Noemia Malbec** is a celebrated **"cult wine"** with a significant aging potential, often compared to some of the finest wines in the world. The vineyard's heritage, with its **pre-phylloxera vines** and organic cultivation, creates a wine that is not only distinct but deeply rooted in Patagonian history and tradition, standing out as one of the purest expressions of Malbec.

Wine Pairing Ideas

- **Herb-Crusted Lamb**: Complements the wine's dark fruit and mineral notes, with the herbaceous crust enhancing its complexity.
- **Grilled Steak**: The wine's structure and balanced acidity match perfectly with the richness of a well-marbled steak.
- **Venison with Berry Reduction**: The wine's fruit intensity and spiced hints harmonize with the gaminess and fruit reduction.
- **Aged Manchego Cheese**: Pairs beautifully with the wine's persistent finish and layered texture.



Vinous (Antonio Galloni) (VN): 96 Points (2020)

The 2020 Malbec originates from a 1932 plot planted in Mainqué, Río Negro, and underwent a two-year aging process in barriques and 500-liter barrels. Due to the warm vintage, this Noemía showcases a distinct character compared to the 2021 vintage tasted alongside. With a purple hue, the fruit-forward nose presents cherry and sweetbriar notes, accented by dried floral tones. Dry and relatively lean in comparison to other vintages, the 2020 offers good balance and a flavorful palate. The mouthfeel is a bit more one-dimensional than usual, but it lingers long.



Wine Enthusiast (WE): 94 Points (2020)

Winemaker Hans Vinding-Diers sources fruit from 92-year-old Selection Massale vineyards in the Río Negro Valley to make this delicious Malbec. It starts with a nose of sweet spices and peppercorns. The palate has tension and bright fresh fruit, showing black and red berries, clove and hints of pink pepper.

Robert Parker (RP): 95 Points (2019)



The serious 2019 J Alberto comes from certified organic vines (Ecocert), but the label does not carry the organic seal. It comes from a 66-year-old ungrafted vineyard planted with Malbec interplanted with around 5% Merlot, and it fermented with some whole clusters in 5,800-liter stainless steel tanks with indigenous yeasts and a soft vinification by plot; there are five different soils, and it's vinified by soil. It was a bit closed at first and slowly opened up to red and black fruit and subtle spice. Part matured in concrete eggs, part in French barrique and 10% in demi-muid, and the wine rotates between these containers as needed with very low sulfur, as the wine is protected by the lees that keep the wine alive. The wine is very lively and vibrant, with very good freshness, refined tannins and clean, focused and pungent flavors that give it very good length. 11,00 bottles produced. It was bottled in February 2020.
