
The Beaulieu Vineyard Georges de Latour Private Reserve is a timeless Napa Valley Cabernet Sauvignon, embodying the rich legacy and innovation that define Rutherford's most iconic wines.



BV Georges de Latour Private Reserve Cabernet Sauvignon 2020

California, USA





The 2020 vintage faced unique challenges, with a **warm, dry winter** and a smaller-than-average yield. However, the region's **cool mornings and warm days during summer** allowed Cabernet Sauvignon to thrive, achieving concentrated flavors and balanced acidity.



The Georges de Latour Private Reserve is meticulously crafted in a **state-of-the-art facility dedicated to this wine alone**. A portion of the wine undergoes fermentation in **new French oak barrels**, creating early integration of texture and richness, while the rest is fermented in **stainless steel and concrete tanks** to maintain fruit freshness.

After extended skin contact for maximum extraction, the wine was pressed and aged for **24 months in 95% new French oak barrels**, with malolactic fermentation completed in barrel. A small percentage of **Petit Verdot (7%)** was added to enhance complexity and aromatics. This meticulous process ensures a wine of exceptional structure, balance, and elegance.

Tasting Notes

- **Color**: Deep, saturated ruby with a dark purple rim.
- **Aroma**: A fragrant bouquet of ripe dark berries, black cherry, grape compote, and black plum, layered with notes of wild violet, fresh spearmint, bay laurel, and warm earth. Oak influence adds vanilla, caramel, and allspice.
- Palate: Full-bodied and multilayered, with dense dark fruit enveloping the
 palate. Savory notes of bittersweet dark chocolate, tobacco leaf, leather, and
 graphite add nuance. The structure is framed by pronounced "Rutherford Dust"
 tannins, offering a firm yet cocoa-powder-like texture. A lively acidity ensures
 freshness, while the finish is long and satisfying.

Did you know?

The Georges de Latour Private Reserve Cabernet Sauvignon, first released in 1936, is a **pioneering wine of Napa Valley**. Its iconic status reflects the vineyard's legacy and the seamless marriage of state-of-the-art technology with traditional winemaking methods.

Wine Pairing Ideas

- **Grilled ribeye steak with rosemary butter**: The wine's tannic structure and savory depth complement the richness of the steak.
- **Braised short ribs with red wine reduction**: Its dark fruit and earthy notes enhance the dish's robust flavors.
- **Wild mushroom risotto**: The wine's cocoa and graphite nuances align beautifully with the risotto's umami tones.
- **Aged cheddar or Gouda**: The wine's firm tannins and dark fruit pair excellently with the nutty, creamy texture of aged cheese.



Wine Enthusiast (WE): 97 Points (2020)

Fascinating, fresh and ripe fruit flavors fill this full-bodied, velvety-textured wine with blackberries, raspberries and cranberries. Subtle oak spices add interest from the aroma through the finish. Decant this time-tested wine if drinking soon. Best from 2027–2040.



Robert Parker (RP): 92 Points (2020)

While some wineries opted to skip the 2020 vintage, BV has bottled a seemingly excellent 2020 Cabernet Sauvignon Private Reserve Georges de Latour. It features black cherries, cassis and toasty oak on the nose, while its medium to full-bodied palate is a bit coarse and open-knit, but it shows no overt evidence of smoke taint to this taster, as the wine finishes long and velvety.
