

Aconcagua Valley, Chile

Region and Vineyards



The vineyard blocks are planted on **north and northeast-facing hillsides**, between 5° and 25° slopes, with soils of **volcanic**, **colluvial**, **and alluvial origin**. Max I, with its mica-rich clay-silt soils, and Max II, with deep sandy-loam volcanic substrates, contribute density and aromatic lift, while Max V's **gravelly alluvial soils**—containing up to **50% stone content**—add tension and minerality. Planted between 1978 and 1999, the vines here yield fruit of **low vigour and high concentration**, ideal for crafting long-lived reds.



The grapes were **hand-harvested in the cool morning hours**, sorted meticulously on **double selection tables**, and fermented in **small stainless steel tanks** for precision and control. Extraction was tailored with up to **three pump-overs per day**, and **maceration times ranged from 8 to 30 days** depending on plot and development.

The wine was then aged for 22 months in French oak barrels (65% new), undergoing malolactic fermentation, natural clarification, and stabilization within the same vessel. The final blend combines 67% Cabernet Sauvignon, 20% Malbec, 9% Carmenere, and 4% Petit Verdot, selected for complementary textures and aromatic complexity. This restrained and elegant vintage reflects both meticulous winemaking and climatic resilience in a season marked by Chile's driest winter in 50 years.

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Tasting Notes

- **Color:** Deep garnet with purple hues and excellent clarity.
- **Aroma:** Lifted notes of cherries, raspberries, cassis, cocoa, clove, and hints of violet and dry earth.
- **Palate:** Medium to full-bodied with refined tannins, bright acidity, and layered flavours of red and black fruit, sweet spice, and graphite. Great tension and length, built for aging.

Did you know?

The **Don Maximiano vineyard was founded in 1870**, and this wine pays homage to Errazuriz's visionary founder. It has since become one of Chile's **flagship Bordeaux-style reds**, consistently representing the **evolution of fine wine in the Aconcagua Valley**. Max I block remains one of the **oldest Cabernet Sauvignon plantings** in the region still in production.

Wine Pairing Ideas

- **Dry-aged ribeye with rosemary potatoes** The wine's structure and depth match beautifully with charred, marbled meats.
- **Grilled portobello mushrooms with balsamic glaze** Earthiness and umami meet the wine's graphite and floral notes.
- **Duck breast with cherry reduction** A sublime match for the wine's red fruit and spice-driven complexity.
- Lamb tagine with prunes and almonds Aromatic spices and slow-cooked textures highlight the blend's warmth and layered profile.

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Robert Parker (RP): 94 Points (2020)

Cropped from a warmer year, the 2020 Don Maximiano Founder's Reserve kept the contained alcohol to 13.5% through an early harvest. The blend was 67% Cabernet Sauvignon, 20% Malbec, 9% Carmenere and 4% Petit Verdot, one of the lowest amount of Cabernet in years, trying to polish the tannins with more Malbec. The truth is that they managed nicely; the wine is a little more austere, but there's no rusticity or dryness. This wine changed and they lowered the new oak to 60%, and 10% of the volume matured in foudre. 12,500 bottles produced. It was bottled in February 2022.
